#### **Principal's Report**

Welcome to Term 2. We welcome this term Adam Perrotta who has come to us from Adelaide. He will be teaching a range of subjects. Currently Kevin Knott is on long service leave and we are lucky to have Andi Zerk filling in for him. You may be aware that Nikki Cook had a



fall late last term and is struggling with a back injury. He is trying to return as soon as he gets medical clearance and whilst laid up, is going above and beyond by planning all learning, and particularly working with his Year 11 and 12s from home.

#### Semesters, subjects and interviews

Already we are into our learning with a vengance, knowing we have 8 weeks until the end of semester and resulting our Stage 1 and 2 SACE students. This time last year, as a recent newcomer to Penola High School, I didn't fully grasp what a change in semester means. Being primarily from a primary education background, where we cruise from term to term, this end of semester came with a jolt. I wonder if parents understand this also? This means for all students other than Year 12, they will all change subjects in Week 9 of term 2. For Year 8s it is a little change, from Home Ec to Tech or vice versa, in Year 9 two subject choices change, by Year 10, PLP is commenced, the first step in achieving their SACE, and 2 choice subjects, and for Year 11s, perhaps every subject changes and Research Project is added. Why am I telling you this? Because I am hopeful you take up a couple of opportunities in the next weeks.

Firstly, book in for student/teacher/parent interviews if your young person is in Years 9/10/11 or 12 on Tuesday 18 May 2021. (Information out this week) Make sure you bring your young person because this is a place we can work together to help make decisions and ensure we select the best mix of subjects with them.

Year 8s are holding Round Table meetings as a trial at the end of semester for their parents so stay tuned for more information later in the term.

Secondly, start talking with them now. Talk about how they believe they are going, and any concerns they have. Be ready for 'it's boring', and then dig deeper by asking questions like 'what are you learning about?' or 'can you see this being something useful for the future?' If they cannot answer this then we as teachers, need to know as these understandings and connections are the start of students selecting their pathway to future employment.

#### Pupil Free Days: Friday 14 May 2021 and Monday 17 May 2021

Our school hosts the Penola Coonawarra Arts Festival opening and the John Shaw Neilson Art Show, on Friday 14 May 2021. I know many students work for local businesses and are no doubt booked up to work over this weekend. We have chosen to close on Friday to allow students and families to be a part of the Festival, however, our CAFÉ students, and other Food and Hospitality students play an enormous role in catering for this opening. We need as many as possible, if not committed, to come to school on Friday afternoon and early evening to prepare, cook, serve and clean up this event. This forms a large component of their assessment. Please support us by encouraging those who can, to help out and in doing so put a proud face forward for our school.

On Monday 17 May 2021 our staff are working on Task design as a team. We provide a range of assessment tasks in all subjects across all year levels already. However, we know that if students are to be able to get high grades, tasks need to change at times. Our SACE and Year 8-12 data shows we are getting very few As and our goal is to change this. We hope to work with a Learning Improvement Officer from Adelaide and our Principal Consultant to challenge any old ways of thinking and move to exciting changes.

#### Our grounds are changing..

Slowly! Latest update regarding the carpark and court situation is we are a very low priority for asphalt due to road construction occurring. Whilst I have attempted to get this moving, it appears we just have to wait. However, other projects are beginning. Justin, Dave and the boys groups are removing overgrown shrubs in the quad so we can paint the seating and replant a mediterranean style food garden. The lines are bold and bright on the basketball court with a new 4 square court especially for Year 7s. Planting has begun and we are beginning to design spaces for students to congregate along the front areas of the school. We hope to soon rip out the ghastly 60's concrete and pebble feature near the front foyer doors and establish a small indigenous garden and seating area there. Out in the Agriculture area we have Hocus Pocus, Hula Hoop, Heather and Hopscotch our mini goats who are settled and loving life. Slow and steady......

#### **Attendance**

Week 1 attendance was an enormous improvement at 85%. Well done. This compares to a very concerning 74% at the end of Term 2. (Most of these were unexplained or family reasons, not being unwell)

#### Australian Research

- Of 1200 SA high school students, 11% have been found to use technology at an unsafe level.

- 54% of games on Facebook include gambling themes.
- Five out of 22 popular video games reviewed met the criteria for gambling including the option to cash out winnings.
